CHILDREN'S ACTIVITY CENTER

The Children's Activity Center (CAC) is a great asset for SVCC which allows your kids to enjoy a great atmosphere and numerous activities while you take advantage of what you want to do throughout the rest of the Club.

In order to make the CAC experience the best possible for all involved, your help and cooperation is expected.

CAC REMINDERS

- Please allow enough time to sign in all kids and inform us of any outstanding issues we should be aware of relative to your child.
- Please DO NOT bring in any sick children (if they have a fever or otherwise are ill, you will be contacted to pick them up).
- Make sure all kids in diapers are "changed" prior to entering and provide additional diapers in their bag.
- Leave "personal" toys or other such items at home.
- You MUST REMAIN on SVCC property (not in the development or elsewhere) to leave your child in the CAC.
- Absolutely NO outside snacks/food will be allowed inside the CAC. Many children have allergies to certain foods (most commonly peanuts). In an effort to minimize the problem, our snacks are limited to Cheerios and Goldfish and we do not allow any food items to be brought into the CAC.
- Sign In/Out: Please remember to sign in your child's FIRST & LAST NAME as well as your SVCC location (fitness, tennis, golf, restaurant, etc.).
- If you DO NOT sign your child/children in, there will be an additional \$5 charge added to your bill (daily and monthly included).
- Non-Member fees are \$7.00 per child for the first two hours and \$3.00 per child for each additional hour.

Please remember it's your responsibility to pick up the children prior to closing time, NOT the SVCC staff.

- Feeding Policies: CAC personnel will only bottle/sippy cup feed infants and toddlers. No solid baby foods.

Please keep in mind the CAC is a service provided for our members. Those who choose not to follow the rules WON'T be allowed to use the service.

CLUBHOUSE HOURS OF OPERATION

The Clubhouse will be open at 8:00 AM to 10:00 PM 7 days a week. These times are subject to change when special events, weather, etc. warrant.

THE GREEN SIDE OF THE VALLEY WITH JASON

The Fall weather is here and it feels good to be heading towards cooler weather. Now that we are in temperatures that fall below 32 degrees, I would like to remind everyone that we will have frost delays and it is extremely important that you **STAY OFF THE TURF** during the frost delays. Walking on frozen grass will damage or kill the plant and will take months for us to get it repaired or grown back in. I would also like to take this time to explain that the Driving Range and Practice Greens are grass and when we are on frost delays these areas will be off limits as well. The only area that would be available to golfers at these times will be the mats at the top driving range tee. Please consult with the Golf Shop on these matters.

The month of October was a busy month as we had some great weather and the turf slowed down enough for us to knock out a few projects, like working on the greens. The main focus was to get #8 & #18 greens back in playable conditions. We started out by seeding these areas and quickly realized that we may be able to get the seed to grow but, in the middle of the summer we are probably going to have a lot of the same issues as we have had in past seasons. The reason we know this is because these greens have a 1" black silt layer in them (see picture) that does not allow water or fertility to penetrate through this layer. After analysis, we decided to dig out 4-6" of the greens mix and replace it with some new sand and peat mix that we had left over from the chipping green construction. We then went to our sod nursery and laid as much of the nursery green sod as we could. The guys did a great job on this project and we are hoping the change of mix will help during the hot summer months of next year. There is still more work to be done in these areas but, I am certainly glad we were able to get a big portion of these areas knocked out this month.

A few other projects that got done in October were the cutting of the scrub brush areas throughout the course including the left of number one. We also started to cut out any hollow or dead trees in these areas and will continue to remove any dead or hollowed out trees. The crew was also able to sod some areas throughout the golf course this month. Obviously the aforementioned greens were sodded, as well as some small fairway and rough areas on #10, #11 and the Driving range. The Chipping Green made some huge strides and will be open in the month of November. The top tier will be the area that will open first as we will place the cup in that area until the bottom tier catches up.

One of the main areas of focus going forward will be bunker renovations. The plan is to start with some of the smaller bunkers, like number 8 and 10 green side bunkers. We will remove the contaminated sand that is currently in there, fix existing drainage before placing a liner in the bunker that will help eliminate rocks and silt from coming up from the bottom of the bunker. This should help keep the white bunker sand clean, as well as make them more consistent to play out of. During this process we will be eliminating a few bunkers that do not come into play and are really more of a maintenance headache, as opposed to being an asset to the course playability.

In closing I hope everyone had a fun Halloween and I hope you enjoy your Thanksgiving! I was able to drive the tractor for the Fall Festival hayride this year and really enjoyed watching the youngsters.

PERSONAL CARTS & VEHICLES

Personal Carts and Vehicles will NOT be allowed behind the Clubhouse or on any cart paths. Personal vehicles may only be driven on the **ASPHALT** portions of the Clubhouse parking lot and are to be parked in the designated cart parking spaces.

Please monitor the drivers as many of you have expressed concerns about the "reckless" driving.

COMMUNITY CART MAINTENANCE & REMINDERS

MAINTENANCE - It's very important that your leased cart is well maintained. Therefore, if you are leasing a cart we **REQUIRE** that you bring your cart in for monthly service. We will check the battery water level, check the tire air pressure and clean the cart. Your cart should be ready for pick up within 24 hours.

DON'T BREAK YOUR LEASE AND LOSE YOUR CART!!!

You are in violation of your lease if you are:

- Strapping kids in the bagwell.
- Allowing anyone not in your household to drive the cart.
- Stopping at a house during a round to get food or beverages.
- Letting kids without a driver's license (not a permit) drive the cart.
- Driving anywhere on the course without first checking in at the Golf Shop **PRIOR** to playing (and yes that includes at night).

FROST DELAYS: A BETTER UNDERSTANDING

In our area of the country, golfers occasionally face frost delays in the winter, thus pushing back starting tee times. When frost is present golf course superintendents delay play until the frost has melted. This is done to prevent damage that affects the quality of the playing surface.

Frost is basically frozen dew that has crystallized on the grass, making it hard and brittle. A grass blade is actually 90 percent water, therefore it also freezes. Because of the short mowing height (sometimes as low as 1/8 inch) and fragile nature of the turf, putting greens are most affected by frost. Walking on frost-covered greens causes the plant to break and cell walls to rupture, thereby losing its ability to function normally. When the membrane is broken, much like an egg, it cannot be put back together.

Golfers who ignore frost delays will not see immediate damage. The proof generally comes 48-72 hours later as the plant leaves turn brown and die. The result is a thinning of the putting surface and a weakening of the plant. The greens in turn become more susceptible to disease and weeds. Frost also creates a delay on a golf facility's staff as all course preparations are put to a halt until thawing occurs. Golf carts can cause considerable damage, therefore personnel cannot maneuver around the course to mow, change cup positions, collect range balls, etc.

The most important thing is for Shadow Valley Members to understand the how's and why's of the delay and in turn gaining a greater appreciation for the golf course. It would also be wise to give the golf shop a phone call before heading out to play to see if tee times have been pushed back due to frost.

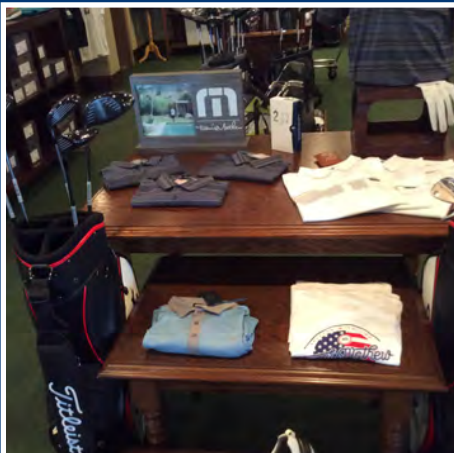
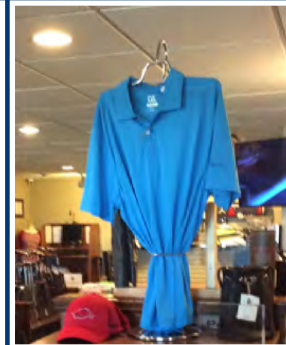
